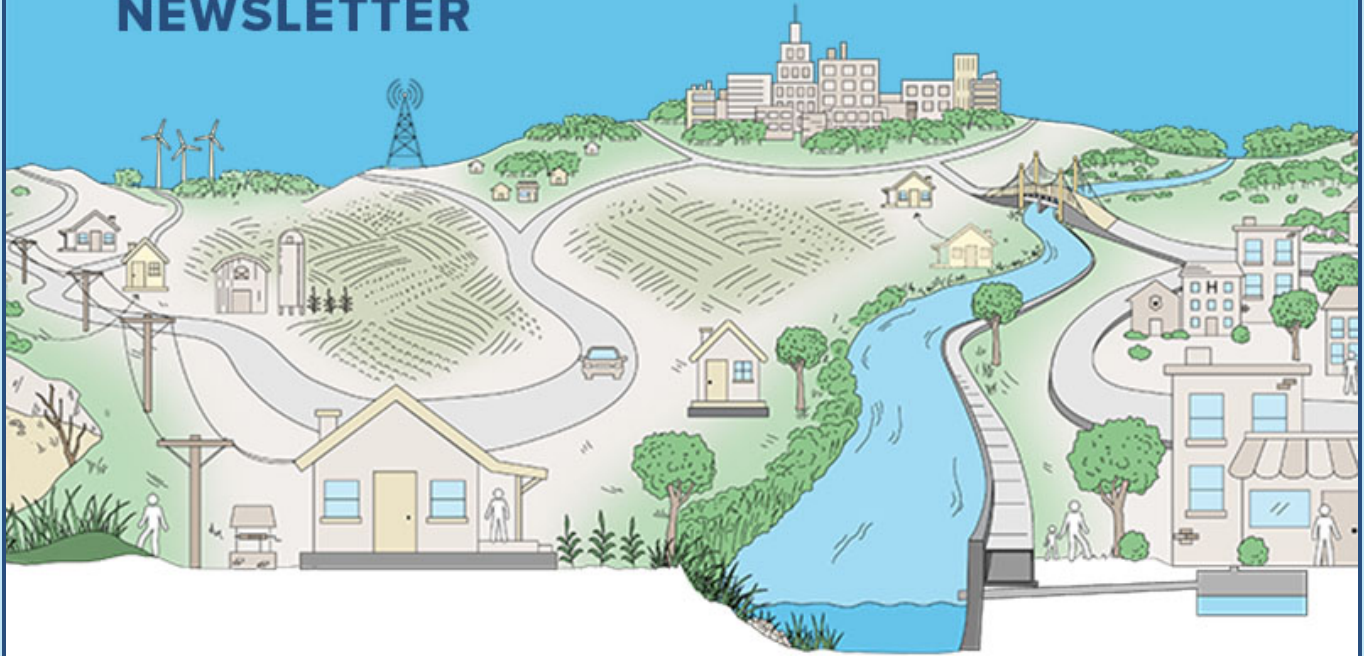

Coastal Resilience Master Plan, Phase 2 Update



Phase 2 of the [Coastal Resilience Master Plan](#) is underway. The updated plan is scheduled to be completed in December 2024. Phase 2 will include information about:

- Areas vulnerable to rainfall-driven and riverine flooding.
- Impact assessments to understand who and what is likely to be most impacted by flooding today and in the years to come.
- Financial opportunities and needs to build flood resilience.
- An inventory of projects, initiatives, and funding opportunities in the Coastal Resilience Web Explorer.

The Coastal Resilience [Technical Advisory Committee](#) (TAC), an advisory body tasked to help DCR create and carry out the plan, met on September 19.
